EXPANDED VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES AT BETHEL WOODS CENTER FOR THE ARTS

(March 25, 2008) BETHEL, NY - Bethel Woods Center for the Arts has announced a full range of rewarding volunteer opportunities for 2008. Members of the local community who are interested in being a part of the exciting season at Bethel Woods Center for the Arts, and would enjoy providing support during concerts, serving in the new Museum at Bethel Woods, or assisting with educational and administrative activities are encouraged to become a volunteer.

"Our volunteer program offers an amazing way for individuals to become active in their community and the arts, while enriching the quality of life in Sullivan County and the surrounding areas", says Darlene Fedun, Senior Director of External Affairs.

Volunteers have contributed to the success of Bethel Woods since its opening in 2006, playing a critical role during the busy summer concert season, during the fall Harvest Festival, and will now assist with The Museum at Bethel Woods up to ten months per year. In 2007 approximately 60 volunteers provided more than 3,000 hours of service in a variety of roles. Currently, there are many opportunities available: in Guest Relations serving as a Greeter, providing guest assistance at performances and special events, assisting ushers during concerts, in The Museum at Bethel Woods as a gallery assistant and at the Welcome Desk, and in an office environment helping administration with the volunteer office and with the Friends program.

Volunteers are needed seasonally and on a year-round basis, with an average commitment of eight to twenty hours per month. Orientation and training are provided to all volunteers. Mid-career adults and retirees have made up the majority of Bethel Woods volunteers, however, anyone over the age of sixteen with an interest in community service and the arts is encouraged to get involved.

"Bethel Woods was envisioned to serve the community in many different ways, obviously to entertain, but also to raise awareness, exposure and involvement with the arts, and the rich history of our region. Our volunteer program provides an opportunity for members of the community to become truly involved in supporting the vision of Bethel Woods, and we will continue to develop additional opportunities to become a part of the Bethel Woods family," adds Peter Lane, CEO of Bethel Woods Center for the Arts.
